From the Rector, Fr Edward: Dear Christ the King Parish Family:

Compassion and dialogue are essentially vulnerable positions.

If we are into control and predictability, we will seldom descend into the weakness of listening or the scariness of dialogue. We will not only be incapable of hearing others, but will also be incapable of hearing God. How we do anything is how we do everything. If we spend all day controlling and blocking others, why would we change when we kneel to pray? Faith, frankly, demands faith—not proof, certitude, predictability, control, or the comforts of authority assuring us that we are always right. Our temptation is often to create a non-relational Christianity and non-relational leadership styles, so we can have all the bases covered by custom and statute, and don't ever have to enter into the scandal of particularity. Prayer, perhaps more than anything, is the school of relationship and particularity. We should be the experts in these areas—if we are people of prayer. —from The Wisdom Pattern: Order, Disorder, Reorder by Richard Rohr, OFM

From Healing Hunger Food Pantry... Happy New Year! Healing Hunger Food Pantry was very busy the last two months of 2020.

Fr. Jose applied for, and received, a grant from Orange County CARES. Part of the grant, about \$20,000, was designated for food and had to be used during the months of November and December. We doubly-blessed our monthly giveaway clients and had five extra giveaways besides. Our families from Little Steps were served in November, and then again in December, with a huge amount of food going home with each child over the break. In addition, we delivered food bags to seniors at Magnolia Towers, Johnson Manor and El Dorado Apartments. A total of 1,054 families benefitted from the CARES grant. As we weren't required to record the people in each family, I can only surmise that we served at least 5,000 people, probably more! In a meeting with the President of Second Harvest, Fr. Jose learned that our Healing Hunger Food Pantry was one of two pantries in Orange County that saw the most growth in 2020.

Now for our monthly giveaway news... the Young Civitan Club returned in December with their Santa hats on to set a new record of serving 251 families representing 1,037 people. We also had a surprise visit from Commissioner, Mayra Uribe, who donated cases of mac & cheese and pasta, AND, our friends from Alianza, came with coffee, baked goods and live music to bring Christmas cheer! Alianza returned in January with much appreciated coffee, hot chocolate and baked goods in celebration of Three Kings' Day. Fr. Jose and Brent Roberts were dressed as "Kings" which brought smiles to young and old alike... even a photo op or two! Our volunteers braved the cold and gave of themselves to bless 205 families representing 853 people.

Thank you and God bless all who support this ministry with their time, talents or treasure. Know that you are part of a ministry that God is using in ways I couldn't have imagined!
