From the Sr Warden, Michele Keyser: Have you attended a service at CtK in the last few weeks? CtK reopened, as planned, on September 6th and it was a wonderful service. We actually had 46 that first week. The service was not only live and in person, but it was also recorded and LiveStreamed. We have a full AV staff who are housed upstairs in the old choir loft. They make certain cameras roll and sound is excellent in both the church and in the recordings. Their hands are full.

The music has been wonderful. While the choir is not in full attendance yet, we do have the Praise Band most weeks. Even our musicians wear a mask while performing, IF they are not singing.

Everyone in the congregation has come through the front Willow Dr. doors, had temperatures checked with hands sanitized and masks on. If you don't have a mask we do have masks available for you.

The homily was given by the Rev. Canon Scott T Holcombe, Canon of the Ordinary of the CF Diocese. He spoke on the theme of the Day which was "Steadfast in Love", calling our attention to God's steadfast love for us and a word in the Hebrew (Hesed) that reflects that. God's love is constant, steadfast in spite of our behavior towards Him.

Last year's Bishop's cross recipient gave a very touching expression of what the cross meant to her while she wore it. As people noticed the cross and questioned its reason, it gave her the opportunity to witness for Christ by saying and doing things that she did not realize was inside of her.

The outreach for 2019-2020 was the Estah Ministry Outreach and they were presented with \$10,847.00.

The slate of officers presented was unanimously accepted for the New Year, and the 2020-2021 Outreach Project chosen was 'No One Hungry'. This was presented by Marie Hunsaker of St Gabriel's in Titusville. This has grown from the vision of a food pantry in Titusville, Fl. Into an international ministry. They not only provide food but also give hope through the distribution of Bibles, water purification systems, and scholarships to young impoverish students from Belize and the Bahamas. We will be hearing more about supporting this project.

We then proceeded to have a memorial service for Departed Daughters (March 1, 2019 - August 31, 2020). After much prayer each departed Daughter's name was called.

The meeting was adjourned around 11:30. It was a very lovely time and the Diocesan President offered all the chapter presidents the ZOOM that we can use to have chapter meetings.
